Fall Frolic concert Sept. 7



There will be free Margaritas and bagged snacks provided (as long as sup-



They dig in the sand and later it turns into a muck fight. They practice their swim strokes, jump off the pier into your arms, then they do it by themselves to howls and clapping. They learn to ski, then graduate to slalom, then maybe wake board or surf (with proper wake usage). It's also tube rides with brothers, sisters, aunts, uncles, moms, dads and friends while continuing to laugh and scream. Kids learn to fish, catch minnows, turtles and kayak around the lake. And they get paid a penny a piece for every Zebra mussel they remove from the pier! They learn to sail a Sunfish and then an MC and maybe enter a

regatta. Birch Lake provides a place for kids and grandkids to enjoy a couple weeks at Camp Tannadoonah. They enjoy the magic of sparklers, the sweet taste of S'mores, and then the fireworks on the 4th of July after which, the following morning, the whole family heads to the Camp for a breakfast of pancakes and sausage!


club. We can. I do.





Roasted cherry tomatoes with angle hair pasta

Prep Time: 20 mins Cook Time: 39 mins Total Time: 59 mins Servings: 2 Yield: 2 servings



Ingredients

- 1 (10 ounce) basket cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 teaspoon minced garlic
- salt and ground black pepper to taste
- 4 ounces angel hair pasta
- 3 basil leaves, cut into thin strips, or more to taste
- 1 dash red pepper flakes
- 2 tablespoons fresh grated Parmesan cheese, or to taste (Optional)

Directions

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Combine tomatoes, olive oil, garlic, salt, and pepper in a bowl until well mixed; spread on a shallow-sided baking sheet. Bake in the preheated oven until tomatoes are soft and wrinkled, 25 to 30 minutes.

Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Cook angel hair pasta in the boiling water, stirring occasionally until tender yet firm to the bite, 4 to 5 minutes. Drain; reserving a small amount of cooking water. Spoon tomatoes with their juices into a small saucepan; add basil and red pepper flakes. Mix in reserved cooking water to thin tomato mixture to desired consistency. Cook and stir over low heat until warmed, about 5 minutes; stir in pasta.

Top with Parmesan cheese before serving.

Last week of camp is biggest ever

e're into the last week of camp for the season, and while last week was the biggest week to date, this week is even bigger! We have 179 campers this week, compared to 176 last week. I got to spend fourth period this week on the MC sailboat teaching an advanced sailing class for campers who are 12 and older and had taken sailing in the past. I haven't had much opportunity to sail this year, so it was fun to be out on the water with the campers.

As we wind down our camp season, our staff is starting to prepare for the rest of the year.

We have a rental group coming to camp next week, immediately following our last session of camp. They are from the Basilica of Saint Mary in Livonia, Michigan, an Orthodox Christian church. This is the seventh year that they have rented our camp facilities to offer a camp program to the youth of their church community. This year, they're expecting to have around 80 campers and 50 (yes, 50!) volunteer staff for the week. They call their camp "Village up North."

We provide the facilities, and a staff member on call each day throughout the week they are here, but they largely run their own program for the week. They bring their own kitchen staff, get their own Michigan Camp License, and last year they earned American Camp Association Accreditation for their program. The only staffing we provide is a lifeguard so they can use the waterfront for swimming, canoeing, and kayaking.

Throughout the fall we have other rentals using camp, including a Wilderness Medicine retreat from Spectrum Health in Niles, four weddings, a college retreat, and our annual Grown Up Camp event.

Grown up camp is going to be held September 13-15 this year. We would love to have lake residents join us for the weekend or just for Saturday! It's one of the most fun weekends of the year. You do NOT have to be a camp alum to participate – it's for any adult who would like to spend a weekend at camp. You get to experience camp activities like archery and canoeing and crafts, but we also have grown up activities like cocktail cruises on the lake, yoga classes, and late night camp songs around the fire.

With the first evening being Friday the 13th, our planning committee is intending to have some sort of themed evening activity – perhaps a murder mystery event or something Friday the 13th-related. ering for more information and registration. It really is an amazing weekend with lots of fun people!

I hope everyone remembers to come out on the lake Friday evening, August 9 around 9 pm for our closing candle-light serenade! Campers and staff will start down the stairs with their candles around 9 pm and will assemble on the dock to sing to those who are on the lake in their boats.
